Annual Report July 1, 1983 - June 30, 1984 The Art Gallery Mount Saint Vincent University, Halifax, Nova Scotia INTRODUCTION Once again, the opportunity to look back on a year's exhibitions and associated activities brings a sense of satisfaction. Together, with active assistance and support from every department of the university our full time staff of three and our part time staff of two accomplished the following: . Grants and Fees obtained (\$34,803) Exhibitions shown (27 - 15 MSVU organized)
Travelling exhibitions (3 exhibitions; 25 venues) Illustrated catalogues, posters and events calendars (27)
 Lectures and Presentations (19) . Tours/Classes (71) . Receptions/Meetings (21) . Art Classes and Workshops (66) . Films shown (17) . Interpretive audio-visual material(1) . Acquisitions (2 - one a series of 12) . Attendance (Total: 33,906 in house and extensions) A closer examination of our exhibits and activities reveals the gallery's commitment to work both historical and contemporary by the emerging regional artist; to local and national work by women and media traditionally associated with women e.g. fibre; and to craft. Particularly significant then are four areas of accomplishment: . the 7 part series of craft exhibits Nova Scotia Crafts I-VII (with funding assistance from the Nova Scotia Department of Culture, Recreation and Fitness) which gave a focused, documented presentation of the work of 8 significant contemporary craftspeople (one was a two part exhibition) in our province. . the 20 regional and national presentations of the travelling exhibition The Past in Focus organized the previous year by the gallery (in conjunction with the National Film Board and Media Services, Nova Scotia Department of Education and funded by National Museums of Canada) which enabled exhibiting centres to present complementary exhibits of historic photographs from their own communities. . the 19 out of 27 exhibitions presented over the 12 month period which wholly or in part featured work by women. Outstanding among them were 3 organized by MSVU; the major group exhibit Appearing of work by 6 young women artists carving significant and varied careers outside the region; the Cult of Personality: Portraits by Lynn Donoghue (both funded by Canada Council); and Primary Flowers, large cut-out paintings and watercolours by Charlotte Hammond of Nova Scotia (funded by the Nova Scotia Department of Culture). . the first gallery presentation of work by Nova Scotian fashion designers Rags, organized by our Exhibitions Officer Sandy Miller, and highlighted by a panel discussion which enabled members of the new organization, Fashion Association of Nova Scotia to grapple with some of the problems inherent in any new business. It is no accident that 3 of the 4 exhibitions/activities singled out were those which received outside funding. The university provides us with the space, operational funding and staff which enables our year round commitment to the university and to the outside communities. But it is to the external cultural funding agencies - particularly National Museums of Canada, Canada Council and the Nova Scotia Department of Culture, Recreation and Fitness to which we must turn if

we wish to carry out those special activities which require extra funding for curatorial assistance and documentation.

For the third year I organized and taught the full credit course <u>Introduction</u> to <u>Museum Studies</u> in collaboration with professional personnel from museum institutions and archives in the metropolitan area. Our students become sharply aware of the key role each institution plays in preserving and presenting our cultural heritage. In these beleaguered economic times it is heartening to be part of a network which recognizes and rewards our cultural outreach.

I'll end by giving three rousing cheers:

- . one for the indispensable Deborah Cameron our Office Manager who so efficiently carries out her responsibilities of record keeping; of supervision of the variety of people with whom we work; and responding to our many publics whether in person, by telephone or by mail.
- . one for this year's Exhibitions Officer, Sandy Miller whose critical awareness of good craft made our year's emphasis of it both a challenge and a reward for the profession.
- . and one for Betty Shatford without whom we could not maintain our invaluable Slide Registry of Nova Scotia Women Artists. In addition she provides solid, ongoing support to our exhibition and collection programs.

And after 3 cheers, a tiger - appropriately enough for our president the redoubtable Dr. E. Margaret Fulton who constantly cheers us on.
